



Highland Perthshire One-Day Tour from Edinburgh

Pick you up from your accommodation in Edinburgh and head north... crossing the Firth of Forth with great views of all three iconic bridges.

- **Dunkeld**

Stop to explore this beautiful medieval town, complete with Thomas Telford's bridge across the river Tay, stunning Cathedral, quirky shops and historic buildings.



- **The Hermitage**

A magnificent short walk through some of the tallest trees in the UK, planted by successive Dukes of Atholl and situated alongside the river Braan as it crosses the Highland Boundary Fault. Magnificent waterfalls set amongst stunning Highland scenery.



- **Pass of Killiecrankie**

A beautiful, wooded gorge with the River Garry flowing through. A chance to see the “Soldier’s Leap”...where a British soldier leapt over the river to escape the Jacobites in one of the first skirmishes of the rebellion in 1689.



- **House of Bruar**

Otherwise known as “The Harrods of the North,” this is a celebrated venue for out of town shoppers, it carries stocks of top quality products from all over Scotland, and is a great place to stop for lunch, the only place I know which has a separate fish and chip shop serving lobster and chips! It is set in the middle of beautiful Perthshire countryside, and has a short woodland walk behind it, leading to the Falls of Bruar.





- **Blair Castle**

A chance to explore one of Scotland's most impressive castles, ancestral home of the Dukes of Atholl, and surrounded by magnificent grounds and gardens. Known as the White castle, the building is full of incredible fine art collections of paintings, chinaware and others, complete with period rooms filled with other treasures and exhibitions.



- **Edradour Distillery**

This is Scotland's smallest, but prettiest distillery, perched high above Pitlochry and the river Tummel. A chance to sample a guided tour, as well as some of Edradour's acclaimed single malts.



- **South Queensferry**

Just before the return to Edinburgh, an opportunity to get a closer look at the three Forth bridges. This picturesque town is situated right under the Rail bridge, and a great place for photography, particularly if there is a good sunset to the west. The Hawes Inn is a great location for dinner...and is where RL Stevenson sat whilst writing Kidnapped! Return to your hotel early evening.
